- Accelerated examination applications are special cases under 37 CFR 1.102(d)
- Granted by petition

- Expedited examination applications are special cases under 37 CFR 1.155
- Granted by request



Accelerated Examination

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 Special examining procedure, see MPEP 708.02.VIII. and 708.02(a)

 Design applications must also comply with 37 CFR 1.151, 152, 153 & 154

Objective: to arrive at final disposition within
 12 months of filing



Accelerated Examination DESIGN

MPEP 708.02(a)F.: The 12-month goal is achieved if...

- Notice of Allowability
- Final Office action
- Abandonment

...Final disposition may occur after 12 months.



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Petition Requirements

- Petition to make special under accelerated examination program
- 2. Fee (37 CFR 1.17(h))
- 3. Non-reissue utility or design case
- 4. Filed electronically
- 5. Complete application under 37 CFR 1.51
- 6. Willing to elect without traverse
- 7. Willing to conduct phone interview
- 8. State that pre-examination search was done
- 9. Include accelerated examination support document.



Accelerated Examination

Pre-examination Search (MPEP 8.02(a)I.H.)

- US Patents & patent application publications
- Foreign publications
- Non-patent literature
- Directed to the claimed invention
- Encompass all features of the claims



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Pre-examination Support Document

- 1. IDS citing references most closely related
- 2. Identify all limitations disclosed in references
- Detailed explanation of how each claim is patentable over the reference
- 4. Concise statement of the utility of the invention (except in design cases)
- 5. Showing where each limitation finds support under 35 USC 112/1st paragraph
- 6. ID references disqualified under 35 USC 103(c)



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 If the application is not complete, petition will be denied (MPEP 708.02(a)VIII.C.)

 If the application is deficient, petition will be dismissed; applicant has a single, 30-day opportunity to perfect petition

"...Intended to fulfill a particular need by affording rapid design patent protection that may be especially important where marketplace conditions are such that new designs on articles are typically in vogue for limited periods of time."

Expedited Examination

• 37 CFR 1.155 & MPEP 1504.30

• \$900.00 (37 CFR 1.17(k)) plus

• \$210/\$105 basic filing fee (37 CFR 1.16(b))





- Request for Expedited Examination under 37 CFR 1.155 (Form PTO/SB/27)
- 2. Application is complete (37 CFR 1.154)
- 3. Drawings comply with 37 CFR 1.84
- 4. Pre-examination search...



Expedited Examination

Pre-examination Search

- 1. List of the field of search (e.g., US class and subclasses)
- 2. US patent documents
- 3. Foreign documents
- 4. Non-patent literature



- Can be mailed, hand delivered or e-filed
- For initial filing of papers only:

Mail Stop Expedited Design Commissioner for Patents P.O. Box 1450 Alexandria, VA 22313-1450

 Thereafter fax to "Special Procedures Submission"

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Expedited Examination



- All processing is expedited from the date the request is granted (including appeal)
- Streamlined "filing-to-issuance", not just while on examiner's docket like accelerated examination



Accelerated Examination Applications

- 30 Design applications filed since the beginning of the program in 2006.
- 7 Petitions have been granted.
- 2 Applications have been allowed
- 1 has issued: 6 months, 3 days.

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All applications in 2007: 26,626 were filed

25,819 were allowed in an average of	12.6 months
24,300 issued in an average of	18.3 months

Rocket Docket applications: In 2007,

532 were allowed in an average of	4.1 months
478 issued in an average of	9.2 months

445 were allowed on 1st action

Allowed in an average of	3.1 months
Issued in an average of	8.0 months

308 were filed in 2007. Of those:

267 were allowed in an average of 2.5 months 231 issued in an average of 5.8 months


